Good evening. It is 7 pm Eastern time and it is time for the weekly Pamlico Amateur Radio Club 80 meter sideband net.

This NET meets on each Tuesday night. We meet on the frequency of 3.850 megahertz unless it is occupied and then we choose a nearby open frequency.

This is an informal net for the purpose of promoting the amateur radio hobby, gaining experience with sideband and net operation and as a general information exchange. We welcome all amateur operators to check into the net. You do not need to be a member of the Pamlico Amateur Radio Club to participate in this net.

I am your net control for tonight and my call is (your call), my name is (your name) and I am located in (your QTH)

Before I take general check-ins to the net I would like to ask if anyone has any emergency or priority traffic please call (your call) now.

(If so, handle that first)

Hearing none, are there any stations with Club or NET announcements, please call now.

(handle this now)

This is a directed net; my call sign is (your call) and I will be calling for check-ins in groups by the first letter of your call suffix. Please call in and give your call phonetically, and then normally, along with your name and your location and whether you are with or without traffic. Those persons who do not wish to stay for the informal session should ask to be “checked in and out”.

Let's begin: any stations with a call sign suffix beginning with **Alpha** through **Mike**, please call net control now.

(take notes of call signs, names and locations).

Net control recognizes: (read callsign(s) from your list)

(continue until no more call in)

Now stations with call sign suffix beginning with **November** through **Zulu**, please call now.

Net control recognizes:

We will check for late check-ins, any station call sign suffix throughout the entire alphabet- **Alpha** through **Zulu**. Please call now.

Net control recognizes...

(after no more check-ins)

That concludes the formal portion of our net. Now we will move into our informal portion of the net

Since we have everyone checked in, we will start at the top of the list.

(go to the first person on your list asking for comments)

(Continue with list. After everyone has had a turn then)

This is a last call for any late check-ins- any station, anywhere if you would like to check- in please call (your call)

(recognise any new stations)

Hearing none, I will now close the net and turn the frequency back to normal use in preparation for the Franklin County Ragchew net.
